Humbly and Faithfully Feeding on Christ

Today's first reading from the book of proverbs tells us that only those who know that they lack and desire understanding,

and ask for the gift, can receive Wisdom. There is the need to recognize our hunger for God, because only then could we go (hungry) to be fed with the spiritual food that comes from God. In the gospel, Jesus continued to declare the necessity of feeding on his body and blood, the food that gives eternal life; in so doing we would be letting the life of Jesus grow and take control of our lives.

The people in today's gospel contended with Jesus, wondering what he meant by eating his body and drinking his blood. Their attitude is understandable because it takes faith to understand what he was talking about and to and accept Jesus as food for life. The Eucharist, the main gift of Jesus to all who follow him, has been a life-giving source to Christians down through the ages. It is the source from which all the graces of each and all the sacraments flow. This gift of the sacrament gave Christians the power to be witnesses in the face of death and torture, in the face of temptation and deceitfulness, in the face of oppressive powers and other evils and the lures of this world.

The Eucharist has also empowered so many people down through the ages to grow from sinfulness to holiness, from spiritual and psychological wound to healing or wholeness. This gift of the Body and Blood of Christ has drawn and continues to draw many people into intimate relationship with Christ, the Holy Spirit and with the Father. It is a holy gift. However, as Jesus pointed out in the gospel of St John, faith is needed to access the power of this sacrament, this gift of the body and blood of Christ.

Therefore we must bring hearts filled with openness and hunger to receive Christ and respond to the call to obey the word of God when we come to the Eucharist. We should make out time to visit and spend time in adoration before the holy bread of God. We must be truthful and humble enough to regularly seek reconciliation in the sacrament of penance, to prepare us to receive this gift with true reverence that is due to God. If not, we would receive Jesus in the Eucharist, and we would not be any better than the people of our world. We would not receive the gift of life that was promised by Christ because we receive him without believing in the gift and what we are duty-bound to do before approaching the table of the body and blood of Christ.

Anyone who reverently receives the Eucharist experiences ever-deepening conversion of life towards Christ. It is greatly beneficial for us who are surrounded by evil and greed, to approach God in the Eucharist, daily if possible, to listen to the word of God, and to receive Christ's body and blood. It is also helpful to regularly approach the sacrament of mercy, Penance, to prepare to deeply engage the Lord in the Eucharist. To go to receive the Holy Communion lightly, and in a state of grave sin, is to make a joke of this gift of Jesus, because, a life of sin, displeases God and puts our souls in peril. Therefore, let us go to the Eucharist, in faith and reverence to receive the healing and life that Jesus gives therein.




