



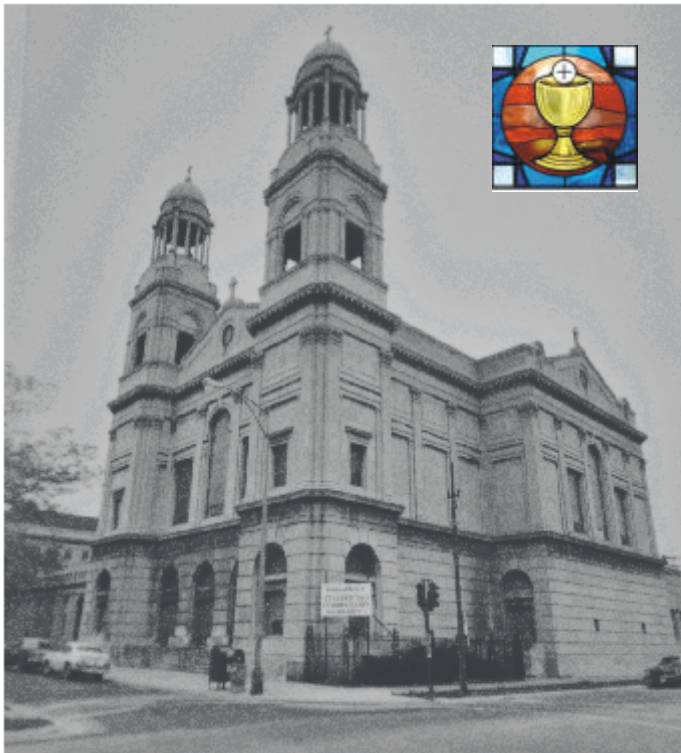

**SACRIFICE
or SUFFERING**

Last Sunday Jesus talked about the danger that attachment to material possession poses to those who desire to enter the Kingdom of God. For Jesus, the heart's inordinate attachment to material wealth or possessions is an obstacle for true Christianity, and makes it very difficult to continue the journey for the kingdom of God. There is reward for those who dare to detach themselves from material wealth and attach themselves to the things of God, but not without persecution, in other words, not without suffering.

In today's gospel passage, which comes after Jesus predicted his passion to the Twelve to prepare them for the passion and suffering awaiting him in Jerusalem, James and John asked to be given seats of honor when Jesus entered into his glory. It seemed as if the disciples were selective in listening to the Jesus. It was as if they did not hear the prediction of his passion, suffering and death. They want to share his glory, but were not ready to consider the suffering that Jesus had to experience.

Surprised at their lack of understanding, Jesus predicted the suffering that awaited all of the apostles in the future. Suffering, born of a life of sacrifice is declared by Jesus as an essential part of discipleship, of Christianity. When the other ten heard James and John's request, they were indignant. Jesus took the opportunity to teach them about power and service. Unlike the lust for power among the rulers/people of the world, the disciples of Jesus had to be filled with the spirit of service, power that was based on service.

In the first reading the prophet Isaiah presents the image or theme of the "suffering servant" who suffers and offered his own life for the sake or salvation or good of others. The same theme is echoed in the second reading and applied to Jesus, the eternal high priest, who is able to understand us because he took on our human condition and has been tested in every way, and therefore he is a worthy and compassionate mediator of humanity with the Father.

This week we are invited to mediate on the example of Jesus the eternal high priest who suffered and gave his life for the salvation of the world, and to try to imitate him or if we have started imitating him, to get better at doing it. Like the disciples we might find ourselves afraid of sacrifice or suffering as part of the lot of the friends of Jesus. But Jesus seems to be saying to us, we cannot be his disciples without caring about others enough to make sacrifices for the good of others. Our society is always in need of people, members, who make sacrifices for the community or society to be better. That is what Jesus was saying to James and John; among Christians, power, position, or authority, should be used for service of others and not to take advantage of others. There is no glory without a cross, and no discipleship without true sacrifice for the sake of others and for the glory of God.

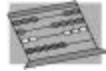


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION HELPS TO BUILD A STRONG FOUNDATION
